OSHA 300A Forms

It is time to prepare your company's OSHA 300A Summary of Work-Related Injuries & Illnesses for 2009, which must be posted from February 1 – May 1.

The summary must list the total number of job-related injuries and illnesses that occurred in 2009 and were logged on the OSHA 300 form. Employment information about annual average number of employees and total hours worked during the calendar year is also required. Companies with no recordable injuries or illnesses in 2009 must post the form with zeros on the total line. All establishment summaries must be certified by a company executive. The form should be displayed in a common area wherever notices to employees are usually posted.
